International students need to register for 10 hours per week; JIU classes are 105 minutes long, so there are seven hours worth of basic courses (four sessions each week) alone. If you take a smaller weekly 2-hour Japanese course, that is 3.5 hours, so add both together and you have more than 10 hours. However, if you want to study a course in English other than Japanese, you can choose the courses above. If there is an overlap between the Japanese course and the above course, priority should be given to the Japanese course.
