Japanese language courses for students who have never studied Japanese before or whose Japanese proficiency

level is N5. There are two levels within N5, so make sure you know which class you are in.

*The N5 level allows students to take the following courses. Registration codes vary from department to

department, so please check the materials of your department.

* Students marked N5A should take N5A classes and those marked N5B should take N5B classes.
